


# Y10 End of term Assessments

#### Leeds Jewish Free School: Y7-Y10 End of term assessments

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#### History

Full paper 1: medicine through time (1hr 15 mins)

This will consist of two parts.

Part A is a source-based assessment about medicine in WW1 (the final medicine topic we will cover).

Q1 = describe two features (4 marks)

Q2a = evaluate two primary sources (8 marks)

Q2b = explain how you would research the topic further (4 marks)

Part B is about all the rest of medicine.

Q3 = explain a similarity or difference (4 marks)

Q4 = explain why (12 marks)

Q5 or 6 (you choose one) = essay question (16 marks)

The key topics to revise for part B are:

- Medieval hospitals
- Hospitals in the Georgian/Victorian period
- Public health/prevention of illness in the Victorian period (e.g. London sewers, Public Health Act, vaccinations)
- Public health/prevention of illness in the modern period (e.g. healthy lifestyle campaigns, Clean Air Act)
- Ideas about the causes of disease in the Medieval period (e.g. religious ideas, supernatural, 4 Humours, miasma, what they believed caused the Black Death)
- Ideas about the causes of disease in the Renaissance period (e.g. transference theory, ideas of Paracelsus and Sydenham, what they believed caused the Great Plague)
- Surgery in the Victorian period (e.g. anaesthetics, antiseptics, aftercare in hospitals)
- Surgery in the modern period (e.g. role of technology)

You should use all your notes on the topics listed for revision, and also look back at practise questions you did for homework to see the feedback for how you can perfect your technique.
